The Environmental Alternative



Living Christmas trees are a wonderful alternative to the traditional cut evergreen. A living Christmas tree is a live growing plant in a pot and must be kept inside all winter, and should be watered and cared for as if it were a houseplant. It should receive moderate to bright light, but should be kept in a cool place if at all possible.

Because of climatic restrictions in Alberta, we cannot easily return a potted evergreen to outdoors that has been kept inside our home for several weeks. Ask our knowledgeable staff about the special care of indoor evergreens.

The biggest advantage gained from having a living Christmas tree is that they stay fresh so they can be enjoyed from mid-November to late January, or longer, without becoming a dry fire hazard. They also maintain their fragrance the whole time.

We will carry several types, and colours of potted holly, juniper and spruce from 15" to 60" tall. While most are not winter hardy in our area, they can be put into large planters and enjoyed on the patio the following summer.



We offer five select premium quality trees and can supply trees up to 14-16'.

Balsam Fir A nice sheared pyramidal tree, dark green foliage. Easy to hang ornaments on.

Comes in sizes 6' to 14' high. Very fragrant.

Douglas Fir A natural looking traditional tree. Good for holding ornaments. Comes in sizes

7' to 9' high.

Fraser Fir Beautiful blue coloured fir tree, sheared for a pyramidal look. Also good for

ornaments. Comes in sizes 7' to 8' high. Great fragrance

White Pine Nice rich green long needled pine tree. Excellent fragrant tree. Comes in sizes 7'

to 10' high.

Blackhills Spruce Nice dark green short needled spruce tree. Good for hanging ornaments. Comes

in sizes 6' to 7' high. This is new to Parkland Garden Centre for Christmas 2005.

Care for fresh cut trees

* Cut 3/4" off of trunk before placing in water.

* The first watering should be hot tap water, this enables the sap to flow while the tree thaws out.

* It is critical that you keep water in the reservoir at all times.

Fresh living gift plants are not cold tolerant and even a few seconds of exposure to our frosty winter weather will damage or shock them. At our garden center we wrap, sleeve and bag all our beautiful plants, free of charge, so they are properly protected for the trip home in even our coldest winter weather!
